### Accommodations

Each room is \$25 per night. You must bring your own linen. The residence hall is near the Faculty Center where we are meeting. ## Accommodations

Motels, hotels, and B&B's are scarce in the vicinity of Rhode Island College.

**RI College** has housing for 10 persons, who must provide their own linens; otherwise, it looks like the rest of us have to use public transportation or have a vehicle.

In the downtown area the **State House Inn** and **What Cheer B&B** (phone for both 401/351-6111) seem to be the closest (near Smith Street, aka Rt. 44, which provides access to RIC).

Further out of town (NW), in Smithfield, at the intersection of Douglas Pike (Rt. 7) and George Washington Highway (Rt. 116) is a **Comfort Suites** (401/231-6300). In Cranston (SW), on Rt. 2 is a **Days Inn** (401/942-4200).

East of Rte, 95 in the downtown area, other lodgings include the **Providence Marriott Hotel** (401/421-0700), the **Courtyard by Marriott** (401/272-1191), The **Westin Providence** (401/598-8000), the **Providence Biltmore Hotel** (401/421-0700), the **Holiday Inn Providence-Downtown** (401/831-3900), and the **Radisson Hotel Providence Harbor** (401/272-5577). The AAA prices seem high to me but perhaps one of the Internet hotel providers (Priceline.com, Hotels.com, or Expedia.com) can do better. Either way, it looks like having roommates is a good idea.

## Travel to Providence

For those of you traveling by car I'm told Providence is about an hour from Boston. But there are other ways to get there...

**Greyhound** leaves from South Station and delivers you to Kennedy Plaza where the local city bus can be boarded. Bus 55 Admiral/Providence College has an extension to R.I. College from the Kennedy Plaza. (RIPTA schedules at <http://www.ripta.com/schedules>, fares are \$1.25)

**Amtrak** (<http://tickets.amtrak.com>) leaves South Station and stops in Providence at the 100 Gaspee St. Amtrak Station, where there is a RIPTA Information Outlet. From the RIPTA map it appears that the Amtrak station is accessible by the same Bus 55, shortly after it leaves the Kennedy Plaza for RIC.

## Attractions:

Providence is the home of **Brown University**, the **Culinary Archives & Museum**, the **Rhode Island School of Design** with its **Museum of Art**, the **Roger Williams National Memorial**, and the **Roger Williams Park** with **Zoo & Museum of Natural History** and **Planetarium**. Not to mention, the **State House**.

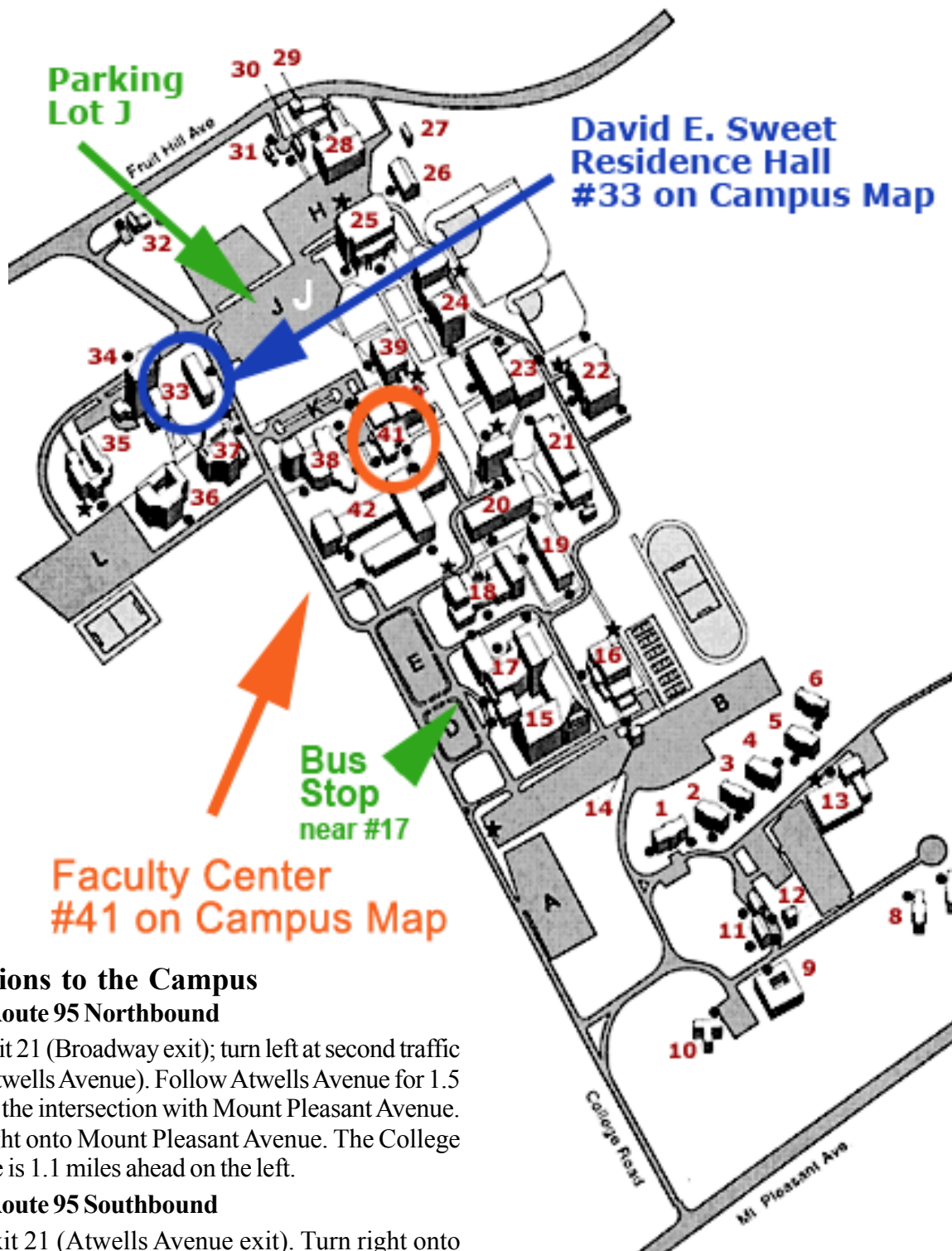

## Directions to the Campus

### From Route 95 Northbound

Take Exit 21 (Broadway exit); turn left at second traffic light (Atwells Avenue). Follow Atwells Avenue for 1.5 miles to the intersection with Mount Pleasant Avenue. Turn right onto Mount Pleasant Avenue. The College entrance is 1.1 miles ahead on the left.

### From Route 95 Southbound

Take Exit 21 (Atwells Avenue exit). Turn right onto Atwells Avenue. Continue on Atwells Avenue for 1.5 miles to the intersection with Mount Pleasant Avenue. Turn right onto Mount Pleasant Avenue. The College entrance is 1.1 miles ahead on the left.

### From Route 295 Northbound

Take Exit 6A to US Route 6 East. Follow US Route 6 East to the Killingly Street (RI Route 128) exit. Turn left off exit and follow Killingly Street to end. Turn right onto Greenville Avenue and follow to first traffic light. Turn left at the traffic light, then bear right at the fork. Campus entrance is approximately 0.2 mile ahead on the right.

### From Route 295 Southbound

Take Exit 7A to US Route 44 East. Follow US Route 44 East for 2.8 miles to the intersection with Fruit Hill Avenue. Bear right onto Fruit Hill Avenue. The College entrance is 1.0 mile ahead on the left.

### From the State House

Follow US Route 44 West (Smith Street) for 2.3 miles. Turn sharp left onto Mount Pleasant Avenue. Follow Mount Pleasant Avenue for 0.4 mile. The College entrance is on the right.

## Public Transportation

The [Rhode Island Public Transit Authority](http://www.ripta.com) operates bus service to the Rhode Island College Campus. Buses run regularly to the College from Kennedy Plaza and Francis Street in downtown Providence, and from Centredale and Olneyville Square. Bus service extends from 7:30am to 4:30pm weekdays.

Bus service to the College is available on RIPTA route 26. Also, route 55 (Admiral Street Line) has been extended to the college which provides an additional 25 roundtrips weekday and 15 roundtrips on Saturdays. Limited service is also available on RIPTA routes 56 and 27. All service picks up and drops off at Roberts Hall (see map #17). See [www.ripta.com](http://www.ripta.com) for details.

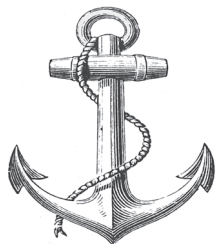
