Biographical Information

Frances Pollitt works at the Maine Historical Society for Maine Memory Network, an online statewide museum of historical objects. She works with hundreds of historical objects from the Society's special collections as well as from other Maine historical societies, museums and archives that contribute their digital images to Maine Memory Network. She serves as the map curator and cataloger at Maine Historical Society.

Frances has lectured and published articles about the historic map collection at the Society and given presentations at national and regional conferences. She has written the text for the recently published book, *Historic Photos of Maine*. She has her Master's in Library Science from Syracuse University, an M.S. in Adult Education from the University of Southern Maine, and a B.A. in Human Ecology from College of the Atlantic in Bar Harbor, Maine. She's served as volunteer for the Peace Corps in Palau, Micronesia and at the Baha'i World Centre in Haifa, Israel. Frances lives in Fryeburg, Maine with her husband and two children.

Stephen J. Hornsby is Director of the Canadian-American Center and Professor of Geography and Canadian Studies at the University of Maine. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of St. Andrews in Scotland and his doctorate from the University of British Columbia, where he was a Commonwealth Scholar. He has published on the historical geography of eastern Canada, colonial America, and India, and has a book forthcoming from McGill-Queen's University Press entitled "Surveyors of Empire: Samuel Holland, J.F.W. Des Barres, and the Making of the *Atlantic Neptune*."

He is currently working with historian Richard Judd and cartographer Michael Hermann to produce a new historical atlas of Maine. Funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities, the State of Maine, the University of Maine System, the University of Maine, and the Bernard Osher Foundation, the atlas has involved more than 30 scholars and has taken more than a decade to produce. Scheduled for publication in late 2010 or early 2011, the atlas promises to be the most comprehensive state historical atlas ever produced.



From the south:

Take the Maine Turnpike (I-95) to Exit 44, South Portland/Downtown Portland (formerly Exit 6A). Follow I-295 to Exit 6B, Forest Avenue North. At the first traffic light, turn left onto Bedford Street. Enter the USM parking garage by taking the next first left onto Surrenden Street immediately after the Alumni Skywalk.

From the north or south:

Take the Maine Turnpike (I-95) to Exit 42, Scarborough (formerly Exit 6). Turn left after exiting the Turnpike onto Payne Road. At the second traffic light turn left onto Route 114 north. Follow Route 114 for 6.5 miles to Gorham center, the intersection of Routes 25 and 114. Continue straight on Route 114 and take the first left after the traffic light onto College Avenue. The main entrance to the Gorham campus is on the right.
