due to legal ramifications.

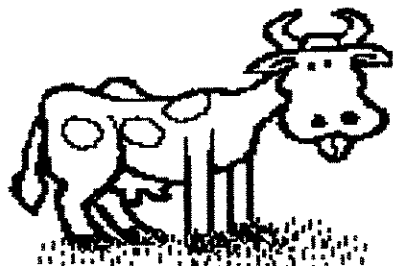

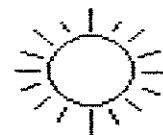
