SPECIAL TRIBUTE IS PAID BY REP. REED TO OUTGOING MEMBER

Retiring Representative Frank Crowther Hailed As Inspiring Leader.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 21—Rep. Frank Crowther, Schenectady Republican, who has served in Congress for 24 years, officially bade farewell to his colleagues this week, with the warning that "we have no trifling task in the days that lie ahead of us in post-war reconstruction."

Members on both sides of the aisle took the floor to praise the skill of the man who so long served on the Ways and Means Committee and the joint Congressional Committee on Internal Revenue Taxation.

Rep. Reed, also sworn in in November, 1918, and who has long sat with Crowther on the committee, told the House the voluntary retirement of Dr. Crowther was "not a funeral at all."

PLAYBOY OF GAY NINETIES SUICIDES

Lake Worth, Fla., Dec. 21—(UP)—Police today listed Byron D. Chandler, 62, the "million dollar kid" of New York playboys in the early 1900's, as a suicide.

Police said he apparently had shot himself on the dock of his estate and fallen into the water. He left suicide notes for his attorney, J. W. Salisbury, and his divorced wife, Betty West, the last of four, a former Paris model.

Chandler had been despondent over his health and having been convicted in Miami last year of sending a lewd letter through the mails to a New York woman. He was fined \$1,000 and given a suspended sentence of a year and a day.

RATION BOARD HEAD ASKS DUNKIRKERS TO STOP USELESS CALLS

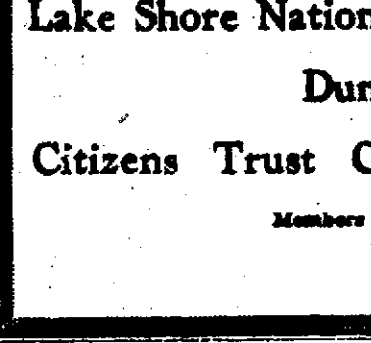
Changes in Gasoline Rationing Will Be Announced in OBSERVER.

Henry Haesel, chairman of the Dunkirk Rationing board, this morning issued the following statement to the general public regarding the change in gallonage value of the B and C gasoline coupons:

"In view of the recent change in value of B and C coupons for gasoline, thereby cutting the mileage of a three month B book from 470 miles to 330 miles, the public is requested to abstain from calling at the rationing board offices or using the telephone merely to obtain information.

"As the details of the necessary changes are worked out, full information will be given through the OBSERVER and Grape Belt. The staff of workers is already overloaded with issuance of certificates for all articles on the ration list and in order to care for those who have as yet received no ration it is essential that the clerical force give this its full attention. As official orders and bulletins are received at the local rationing office they will be passed on to the public through the local newspaper."
