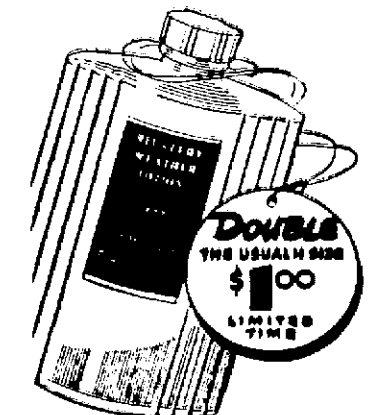

Mr. and Mrs. Davis will reside at 87 Forest place, Fredonia. The groom is employed by the Republic Light, Heat and Power company.

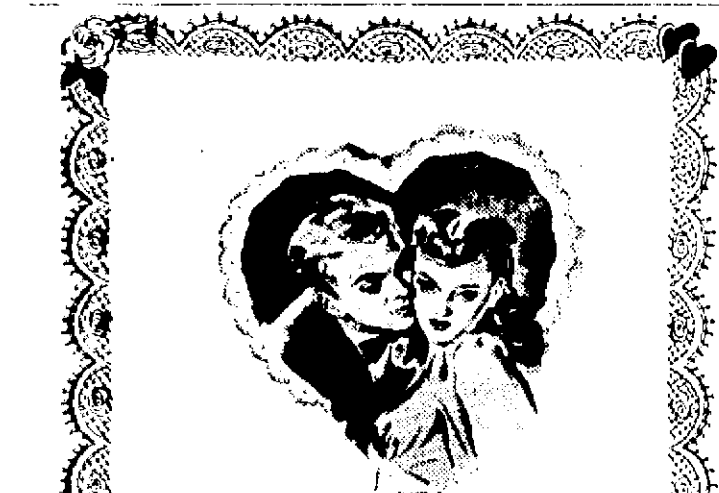

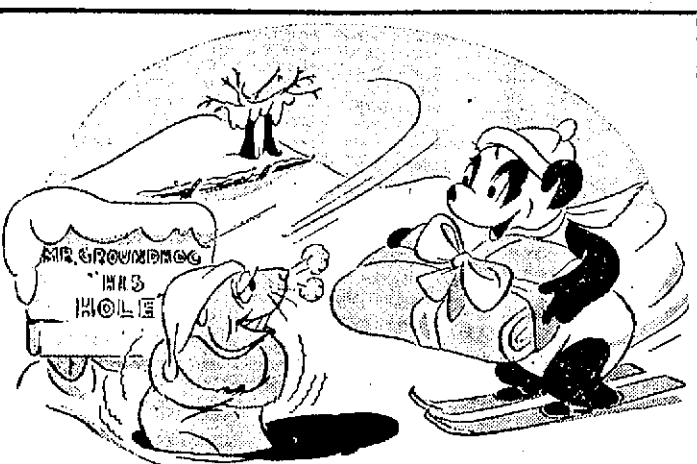
