The new manager avoided any lengthy discussion of Allen at his first news conference.



Shepard did not attend the news conference Friday. He and trainer Tony Bartirome were huddled in the room behind the dugout. The former manager was dejected.

Asked if he had any plans for the future, Shepard shrugged his shoulders.

"No," he said, "I'm going home and I'm just going to sit around the house." He lives in Omaha, Neb.

Shepard, who was hired Oct. 13, 1967 by the Pirates after 18 seasons as a manager in the minor leagues, said he suspected about a month ago he would not be rehired.

"When they don't tell you how well you are doing," he said, "then you begin to see the handwriting on the wall."

The Pirates will finish no higher than third place in the National League's Eastern Division despite having four players among the league's top 10 batters.

Pirate general manager Joe L. Brown was unusually subdued when he announced Shepard's dismissal. He said it would be three or four weeks before the club named a new manager and coach Alex Grammas will guide the club


