Features of the Ancient Greek Revolution¹

- *Rapid Colonization*: Greek settlements appeared all over, from Italy to Western Turkey (next to the Babylonian Empire and later the Persian Empire)
- Crossroads of Culture: Ionia between Persia and Greece
- *Change of Economics*: The development of currency and trade
- This leads to <u>Creation of Records and Writing</u>: From Phoenician pictographs to actual language
 - o Used by merchants to help with trade information
- This leads to <u>Stable Codes of Laws</u>: Expression of power made concrete in written form
- Change in Warfare
 - o New soldiers: hoplites heavily armed foot soldiers
 - o Regimented Army
 - o Soldiers must purchase own equipment
- Rise of a Middle Class: Merchants spread money to more people
- These lead to *Change of Government*: Democracy
 - o Middle class gets political power since they are needed to defend the city or support rulers financially
- Rise of the City-State (Polis): An attitude of belonging to a natural community no longer only loyal to one's chieftain
- Character Traits of these People
 - o Independent
 - o Resourceful
 - o Intelligent and Thoughtful
 - o Obsessed with Beauty
 - o Concern with both Regularity and Spontaneity
 - o Good Speaking
